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**HEARING ON THE APPLICATION OF DYERSDALE ENERGY II, LP FOR UNRESTRICTED RENEWAL OF ITS P-5 AND TO CONTEST THE STAFF DETERMINATION THAT ITS P-5 CANNOT BE RENEWED BECAUSE IT HAS NOT COMPLIED WITH THE INACTIVE WELL REQUIREMENTS OF STATEWIDE RULE 15**

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**FINAL ORDER**

The Commission finds that, after statutory notice, the captioned proceedings came before the Examiners on August 3, 2015. The Examiners have circulated a Proposal for Decision containing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law. Having been duly submitted to the Railroad Commission of Texas at conference held in its offices in Austin, Texas, those Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law are hereby adopted and made a part hereof by reference.

**IT IS ORDERED** that the application for renewal of the P-5 Organization Report for Dyersdale Energy II, LP, Operator No. 237756 is hereby **DENIED**.

**It is further ORDERED** that all P-4 Certificates of Compliance issued to Dyersdale Energy II, LP as operator of record are hereby **CANCELLED** and all related pipeline or other carrier connections are hereby **SEVERED**.

**It is further ORDERED** that Dyersdale Energy II, LP shall bring into compliance with Statewide Rule 15 (16 TEX. ADMIN. CODE §3.15) the wells identified on Appendix 1 and that the Operator's P-5 Organization Report shall not be renewed until such wells have been brought into compliance in accordance with this order. Appendix 1 is hereby adopted and incorporated by reference for all purposes.

**It is further ORDERED** that Dyersdale Energy II, LP and each person who holds a position of ownership or control in Dyersdale Energy II, LP, including Milan Simic, are hereby rendered subject to the terms of TEX. NAT. RES. CODE §91.114.

**It is further ORDERED** by the Commission that this order shall not be final and effective until 25 days after a party is notified of the Commission's order. A party is presumed to have been notified of the Commission's order three days after the date

on which the notice is actually mailed. If a timely motion for rehearing is filed by any party at interest, this order shall not become final and effective until such motion is overruled, or if such motion is granted, this order shall be subject to further action by the Commission. Pursuant to TEX. GOV'T. CODE §2001.146(e), the time allotted for Commission action on a motion for rehearing in this case prior to its being overruled by operation of law, is hereby extended until 90 days from the date the parties are notified of the order.

Each exception to the Examiners' proposal for decision not expressly granted herein is overruled. All requested findings of fact and conclusions of law which are not expressly adopted herein are denied. All pending motions and requests for relief not previously granted or granted herein are denied.

Noncompliance with the provisions of this order is subject to enforcement by the Attorney General and subject to civil penalties of up to \$10,000.00 per day per violation.


