WHAT IS A BROWNFIELD?

A “Brownfield” site is defined by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) as a real property of which the expansion, redevelopment or reuse may be complicated by the presence or potential presence of hazardous substances, pollutants or contaminants.
